

Interments In Trane Cemetery

INFORMATION LEAFLET

This leaflet explains the key steps and considerations when arranging a burial or ashes interment at Trane Cemetery.

Types of Interments

Your loved one could be interred in either a new grave or cremation plot, or into an already purchased plot that we will re-open.

Interments are classed as either full burials (for coffins) or ashes burials (for urns or caskets).

Plot Types available

We offer several plot types to meet different needs and preferences:

- **Lawn Graves:** turfed over after burial, allowing a headstone at the head-end only. Available in:
 - ❖ Single depth
 - ❖ Double depth
 - ❖ Triple depth

Traditional Grave

- **Traditional Graves:** allow kerbs planting and a full memorial surround. Offers more customisation.
- **Ashes Graves:** smaller plots for cremated remains, allowing for a headstone at the head-end only.
- **Cremation Plots:** compact plots, usually in a dedicated area, for urns or caskets of ashes.

How to arrange an Interment

You can:

- Use a Funeral Director – they will guide you and liaise with our Cemetery Administrator on your behalf.

- Apply directly – contact our Cemetery Administrator if you would prefer to handle the process yourself.

Documents required

In order to carry out an interment, we will need the following:

- Interment application form,
- Payment of fees,
- Certificate of Burial or Cremation, and
- Deed of Exclusive Right of

Burial (for re-opening an existing grave).

Exclusive Rights of Burial (ERoB)

When a new plot is purchased, the applicant/s are granted the Deed of Exclusive Right of Burial. The deed confers on the owner the:

- Right to be buried in that grave,
- Authority to allow others to be buried there,
- Control over memorials and inscriptions.

It does not grant land ownership and is valid for a period of 50 years. Only the deed holder may approve the use of the grave.

Transfers must be arranged if the deed holder is deceased.

What happens on the day?

The Burials Team will have prepared the plot before your arrival and will be on hand to guide you to the grave.

The interment is carried out with dignity and respect.

You may choose to have a short service or moment of reflection.

Council staff are available to support you throughout.

What happens afterwards?

Following the interment, the grave is backfilled and made safe. The burials team will tidy away any mats and boards. Flowers and tributes from the service are re-laid on top of the grave.

The plot is left to settle naturally and is topped up regularly, as needed. It can take several months for the ground level to stabilise depending on weather conditions.

Once the ground has settled, the plot will be reseeded to allow the grass to grow back.

If this was a new grave purchase, the grave owner/s will receive a Deed of Exclusive Right of Burial.

Memorials

Memorials can be placed on the plot once the ground has settled.

For full burial plots, this can be between 12 and 18 months, depending on the time of year of the interment and the prevailing weather conditions.

For our ashes plots, we recommend allowing 6 months before having a memorial installed.

A Memorial Permit is required before any headstone, plaque or kerb set can be installed.

Only BRAMM registered memorial masons approved by the Council may carry out the work.

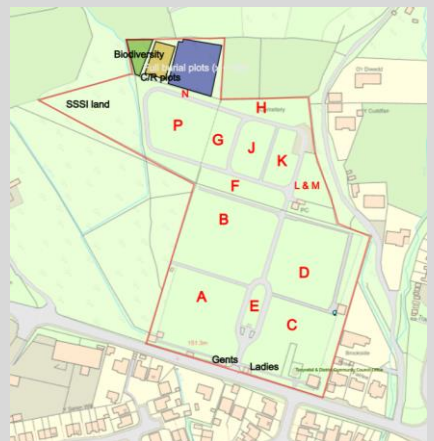
